




Early Life Support Model

- The consultation on the ELS Model lasted for 2 weeks, running from Friday 21st February to Friday 7th March.
- In that time, we received 312 comments across 18 responses, with responses from a mix of Suppliers, LDSOs, Agent, Central Parties and Code Bodies. A response to all comments has been published on the Collaboration Base.

Early Life Support

The Purpose of Early Life Support

- 1. To assure that the new systems and processes are working as expected across the TOM,
- 2. To assure that the central systems are performing as expected,
- 3. To ramp-up the number of Migrations in a controlled manner,
- 4. To share overall performance with industry and to provide a means for industry to provide feedback and discuss performance across the TOM,
- 5. To make informed decisions based on performance against defined measures

What isn't in scope?

The purpose of ELS is not to look at the performance of individual Programme Participants and make this performance known to industry.

It is not to set out the means by which individual participants will get support, this is through Service Management.

Hypercare vs Early Life Support


The key focuses for the Early Life Support Period are to ensure that the central systems and MHHS processes that have been implemented are performing as expected and to mitigate the risk associated to starting the migration of MPANs into the MHHS arrangements.

Hypercare refers to the arrangements that each Central Party, Code Body and Programme Participant will have in place to support the resolution of issues that may arise at go-live / when they qualify and begin operating in the MHHS arrangements.

- Suppliers will not be asked by the Programme to provide specific reporting to support the Early Life Support decision making process
- DCPs will not have explicit roles, however their customers will be expected to engage them as and when required and they will be able to attend the relevant governance meetings.



CONSULTATION OVERVIEW – CROSS PARTY SERVICE DESK & OPERATIONAL READINESS TESTING

Purpose:

 Define collaborative incident and problem resolution across MHHS participants (e.g. Elexon, LDSOs, Suppliers, DIP Operator)

Key Principles:

- Hybrid Service Model as defined in the MHHS Service Strategy Document
- Pre-triage before raising cross-party cases
- Clearly defined escalation, ownership, and closure protocols

Outputs for Consultation:

- Case/Ticket lifecycle flows
- Scenario examples for cross-party case/ticket exchange

Scope:

- Validate cross-party service management processes including Major Incident, Incident, and Problem Management workflows across multiple service desks.
- Retest outstanding SIT defects from Theme 3 Batch 1, including Parent/Child case handling and unscripted scenarios.
- Test updates to the Service Operating Manual and confirm readiness of the Cross-Party Service Desk model for live operations.

Consultation Focus:

- Review the structure, objectives, scope, governance, and delivery plan for ORT to ensure alignment with MHHS Programme expectations and participant capabilities.
- Validate that test scenarios provide full coverage of critical service management processes (e.g. incident, major incident, problem management) and incorporate feedback from participants.



- Consulted on the Migration Framework artefacts from 14 28 March 2025
- 118 comments received from 15 organisations
- No material changes or concerns raised by Participants
- Assurance meeting held on 22 April 2025:
 - No objections were raised for MCAG approval of the Consultation 4 Outputs and the baselining of the Migration Framework
 - A PP requested that the MHHS Migration Thresholds Document be updated to address inconsistencies in the tables outlining the Migration Messages received and sent by the CSS and DSP. (Section 9). This was not submitted as part of the Consultation, but raised after the consultation and recorded in DIN-1189. The Programme agreed to consider these changes when the Migration Artefacts are next updated (before M10).





What is the Settlement Timetable update?

Situation

- The MHHS Settlement Timetable artefacts set out the process for transitioning from the existing 14-month settlement timetable to a shorter 4-month settlement timetable
- The Settlement Timetable artefacts were originally approved at Design Advisory Group (DAG) on 8 November 2023
- Following Change Request CR055 the Settlement Timetable artefacts need to reflect the updated MHHS Programme Plan

Action

• The Programme have updated the artefacts, consulted participants and engaged TORWG to assure the artefacts align with the updated CR055 timelines

Result

 On 16 April '25, the TORWG recommended that the MCAG approve the updated Settlement Timetable Artefacts



Key Changes

- Settlement Timetable is now over 3 financial years (2 financial years previously)
- Hard coded dates removed and mapped to Level 1 milestones, and to start/end dates of financial years
- Changes to the timings of M16 readiness assessments
