

Code Governance




The Code workstream translates the Design baseline into the relevant codes The CCAG is responsible for the Code Drafting Plan, and Code Artefact approval (M6). It reports into PSG Code is organised and drafted across several topic areas, all of which are outlined on the Code Drafting Plan Changes to the Design baseline will be applied to the Code Artefacts after the Design changes are approved A Finalisation and Consistency check will ensure all MHHS Design requirements have been translated into the Code Artefact requirements


This includes Data Services, Meter Services, Registration, BSC Central Services, Interfaces/Data Specification, Migration, Qualification/Governance, Transitional Text, and Consequential Code Change



Spotlight on Upcoming Consultations: BSC Registration



Summary of proposed changes to the BSC documents in scope

- Update new Registration processes, SLAs and interfaces into BSCP705 (LDSO) and BSP706 (SMRS)
- Capture Requirements traceability of code drafting back to the relevant BRs artefact(s) to aid review
- BSCP550 'Shared SVA Meter Arrangements of Half Hourly Import and Export Active Energy' will be updated in a later tranche with new rules for managing appointments for Associated Import and Export Metering Systems
- Consider whether Change of Market Segment process (BP011) could be spun off into its own separate BSCP due to its complexity and the fact that it should be used infrequently
- Reflect MHHS operational choreography covering interactions between CSS registration activities and new MHHS appointment and disconnection processes
- Update SMRS responsibilities to reflect enduring governance, with settlement processes utilising the DIP, and ensuring correct handoffs to DCUSA and REC for cross-code processes, e.g., Disconnection & De-registration



*Drafting does not include active CRs or Design Issue Notifications. Approved changes to the design will be captured post consultation, once the updated design artefacts have been published.

Summary of proposed changes to the REC documents in scope

- Remove Data Aggregators and Data Collectors as CSS Users
- Reflect new process for updating metering point data, covering updates to Related Metering Point relationships and Meter Point Location Address data
- Amend Electricity Enquiry Service (EES) Data Access Matrix to include new MHHS data items and EES Users
- Update market exit and SoLR processes to acknowledge the introduction of the DIP Manager
- Reflect MHHS operational choreography covering interactions between CSS registration activities and new MHHS appointment and disconnection processes
- Update ERDA responsibilities to reflect the enduring governance responsibilities, with settlement processes utilising the DIP, classified as SMRS requirements under BSC governance





Summary of proposed changes to the BSC documents in scope

- New BSCP covering Load Shaping Service, Market-wide Data Service and Volume Allocation Service procedures, timetable, interfaces and validation requirements.
- New Service Description covering requirements for Load Shaping Service, Market-wide Data Service and Volume Allocation Service.
- A new Section S Annex S3 setting out the rules for calculation and provision of data for MHHS including the revised GSPGCF calculations
- Section S updates to include obligations on Suppliers in respect of their appointed Data Services
- Section S updates to include obligations on the SVAA in respect of the Load Shaping Service, Market-wide Data Service and Volume Allocation Service
